





ULBS is part of the FORTHEM alliance, one of the first 17 winners of the European Universities Initiative call for proposals launched by the European Commission in 2019.

The alliance *aims* to bring together a *new generation of open-minded Europeans able to cooperate across languages, borders, and disciplines* in an effort to address societal challenges and skills shortages faced in Europe.

ULBS D-School (The Design Thinking School) is the first Design Thinking Centre in a university in Romania. It stands for collaboration between pupils, students, and the community, but also between professors and staff in the university and partner Design Thinking Centers and Schools in the world.

The Design Thinking method and mindset became popular after the first d.School was established in Stanford in 2003. It is a creative problem-solving method. Since 2020, **ULBS D-School is part of the Global Design Thinking Alliance - GDTA**, together with 22 academic and research institutions from 18 countries, on 5 continents (see the details at <https://bit.ly/3rMjUAd>).



In 2018, the *Hasso Plattner Institute in Postdam*, established and financed by the German businessman Hasso Plattner (co-founder of SAP SE software company), donated EUR 4.2 million to the Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu, the largest donation to a Romanian university in the past 30 years. The funds were spent for research and scholarships: mobilities for students and Ph.D. students, study visits, ULBS Smart 2019 competition, and research excellence awards are just a few examples.
